

AICTE GUIDELINES FOR VISITING FACULTY

AICTE norms for visiting faculty, often referred to as Adjunct Faculty, emphasize their eminence and contribution to the institution. They should be recognized professionals with significant industry experience, and their association should add value to the academic program. Specific qualifications and experience requirements, as well as limitations on their engagement, are also outlined.

Specific AICTE Norms for Adjunct Faculty:

Qualifications:

Adjunct faculty members must be accomplished professionals in their field, recognized by various bodies, and their knowledge should add value to the academic program.

• Experience:

They typically need substantial industry experience, with or without a postgraduate or Ph.D.

Age:

There's no upper age limit for Adjunct Faculty, provided they continue to contribute to the institution.

• Limitations:

There are restrictions on the length of their engagement and the number of times they can be engaged in the same year.

Incentives:

AICTE provides a "certificate of recognition" for activities conducted by the visiting faculty.

Responsibilities of the host institute:

The host institution is responsible for providing necessary support, including accommodation and local conveyance.

Industry-Academia Mobility:

AICTE encourages industry-academia mobility, allowing faculty to take sabbatical leaves to work in industry.
